CANCER CAP BY SHARON ROBINSON

CROCHET – G Hook if you crochet loosely Ch4; sl st to form circle; ch 3 Rnd 1: 12 DC in cir; sl st to top of ch 3; ch 3 Rnd 2: 2 DC in each st; sl st to top of ch 3; ch 3 Rnd 3: *2 DC in 1st st, 1 DC in next st (Repeat from * around) sl st to top of ch 3; ch 3 Rnd 4: Repeat Round 3 Rnd 5: *2 DC in 1st st; 1 DC in each of next 6 st; (Repeat around till the end) DC in last 4 st; sl st to top of ch 3; ch 3 Rnd 6-11: 1 DC in each st; sl st to top of ch 3; ch 3 Rnd 12: Front post in 1st st; Back post in 2nd st (Repeat around to form ribbing), sl st in top of ch 3; fasten off, weave to end. **Acceptable colors**: Tans, Brown, Grey, Med Green, Navy or Dark Multi Colors


CANCER CAP

KNIT - 4 ply knitting worsted weight yarn, size 10 needles
Cast on 76 stitches LOOSELY
K2 P2 until piece measures 6 inches
Next Row – K2 together across Nest Row – Knit across
Nest Row – K2 together
Continue in this manner until 5 stitches remain
Thread yarn through remaining stitches and sew back seam
Acceptable colors: Tans, Brown, Grey, Med Green, Navy or Dark Multi

Clothing Protectors (adult bibs)

Call Starr Myklebust 301-898-9222 and she will send you a full sized pattern.


Place pattern on folded fabric with the straight side on the fold as marked on pattern. Cut 2 of these for each bib. You may use the same fabric or 2 different fabrics for each side. Place cut pieces right sides together and stitch with 3/8 or 5/8 inch seam allowances, all around the pieces except for the inside of the neck. Clip curves, turn and press well. Finish neck edge with single fold bias tape. Put buttons or snaps on the neck, having 2 different positions so the neck may be for different sized necks. Do not use velcro, have you ever had your neck hair caught in velcro?



ONGOING HOMEMAKERS PROJECTS

No-Sew Fleece Throw (Lap Robe)

Cut 2 pieces of Fleece 48" x 60". Same color or coordinating fleece patterns. Place fleece layers wrong sides together. Cut 6" x 6" squares out of both pieces of fleece at each corner. (cut both layers at same time. To make fringe, cut 6" into fleece at 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " intervals around all 4 sides of both layers. Knot fringe pieces together, using 1 strand from top layer & one strand from bottom. You can buy the fleece by the yard or Joann Fabric sells kits for the "No Sew Fleece Throw." Be sure to use their Coupons.



CROCHET NURSERY CAP

Material: Baby Yarn and 'E' Hook

<u>**RIBBING</u>**: Chain 9, turn, single crochet in 2^{nd} stitch and across. Chain 1, turn, 8 stitches. Work in back <u>loops only</u> for 12 inches. Slipstitch ends together. DON'T CUT YARN! Continue as follows:</u>

<u>TOP</u> Chain 2, work 60 half double crochet across, join in top of chain 2. Work for $3\frac{1}{4}$ inches. To decrease:

Work 5 stitches, work 2 together across. Crochet around.

Work 4 stitches, work 2 together across. Crochet around.

Work 3 stitches, work 2 together across. Crochet around.

Work 2 stitches, work 2 together across. Hole will be about the

size of a dime.

Draw yarn through and fasten off.

Make a pom-pom and attach to top. Turn up ribbing if desired

KNITTED NURSERY CAP

Size 6 needles for the cap, size 4 needles for pom pom, and 3 ply baby yarn- 100% acrylic in pink or blue preferred.

Cast on 68 stitches. Next row Knit 2, Purl 2, to the end of the row. Continue in this pattern for six inches.

Next row Knit 2 together, purl 2 together across the row. Next row Purl.

Next row Knit 2 together across row. Next row Purl.

Next row Knit 2 together across row.

Thread needle & take remaining stitches off knitting needle and sew cap. Pom Pom

Take a 2" wide piece of cardboard, wind yarn around it at least 30 times. Slide yarn off cardboard carefully; tie in the middle and cut edges (to make separate strands). Trim loose ends. Use yarn to sew pom pom on the cap.

18" x 18" – crocheted, knitted, or made with material. Must be Washable.
